> **23,000**

Record number of murder investigations opened in Mexico in 2017. Safely remaining in Mexico is not an option.

> **8,848**

Number of people from El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras granted asylum affirmatively (i.e. after affirmatively requesting asylum) between 2014 and 2016.

> **3,502**

Number of people from El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras granted asylum defensively (i.e. after requesting asylum in response to removal from the U.S.) between 2014 and 2016.

> **82**

Percentage of women from El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Mexico screened for asylum who were found to likely to have a credible asylum claim under the Convention Against Torture in 2015.

> **6**

The number of asylum seekers processed daily this summer at the port of entry in Nogales, Arizona.

> **47**

The number of people the Nogales port of entry is capable of holding at one time.

> **0-3**

The number of asylum seekers reportedly being processed at the Brownsville, Texas port of entry.

> **4-6**

The number of weeks asylum seekers currently waiting to present at the San Ysidro Port of Entry.

> **100**

The backlog of people in Mexico waiting to apply for asylum this summer.

> **1.25 million**

1.25 million: how many fewer people arriving at the southern border were processed by Customs and Border Patrol in 2018 than in fiscal year 2000.

> **Nearly double**

The number of Border Patrol agents at the southwest border, as compared to 2000.

> **Double**

Customs and Border Patrol's budget, as compared to 2000.
